### **Smart Nanomaterials**

"Smart" materials—materials that respond to a stimulus or their environment to produce a dynamic and reversible change in critical properties—have enabled progress in many areas, including display technologies, drug delivery, and selfhealing materials for coating applications, among others.

### Nobel prize for chemistry 2023

Alexei Ekimov, Louis Brus and Moungi Bawendi were awarded the Nobel prize for chemistry for the discovery and synthesis of quantum dots



Quantum dots are tiny crystals, often consisting of just a few thousand atoms, made from semiconductor materials



The size ratio of a quantum dot to a football is about the same as a football to the Earth

Because their size is reduced to the nanometre scale, they exhibit quantum effects that determine their characteristics

By manipulating their size, scientists can precisely control their properties and make them emit light of specific colours when they are excited by light

### **Physics of Laser Interactions**



In gas or in vacuum with different geometry

#### Laser interactions commonly involve:

- Energy propagation, electronic excitation, light scattering, reflection and absorption
- Electron-phonon relaxation, heat diffusion, pressure wave propagation, rarefaction and tensile stress, phase transitions, mechanical fragmentation
- Materal removal (ablation), plasma plume expansion, reactions, clustering, etc...
- Often multi-pulse irradiation is used with various scanning and focusing conditions

#### Laser-induced nanoparticle formation

- Green synthesis methods, biocompatibility
- Control over NP properties
- Scaling-up possibilities
- Possibility to create stable ultrastructures, nanoalloys, hybrids, etc.
- Additional laser-particle interactions involve many physical and chemical processes

### **Classical Molecular Dynamics (MD)**

#### Short (ps) and ultra-short (fs) laser pulses



F<Fth

**Desorption:** Atoms, slow surface evaporation

#### F>Fth

Ablation: rapid process, mixture of atoms, clusters and drops

Process can be at T-> Tc

Difficult to model by classical methods

### **Laser Interactions with Nanoparticles**

Molecular Dynamics (MD) simulations are paricularly interisting for phase transitions and decomposition of the ablated material upon the absorption of laser radiation, but also can be used for heating, melting, fragmentation or sintering of NPs

#### AuNP +AuNP, different sizes



Snapshots of cross-sections of two Au nanoparticles with  $d_{p,0} = 3$  (gray) and 4 nm (white) undergoing sintering at T = 800 K at t = 0, 0.01, 0.1, 1, 10, and 30 ns.

#### **MD simulation:** CoNP + Au NP, T<sub>1</sub>=T<sub>2</sub>=2000K

- Simulation starts from a Janus configuration
- Then both particles are heated to the same temperature

Mixing is easier when both particles have comparable sizes and temperatures

### Sintering of a larger metallic Janus NPs with different sizes upon rather weak laser heating



#### Same size Janus NP: strong laser heating



- 0, 100, 150, 200
- 300, 400, 800

Complex dynamics leading to core-shell formation and partial fragmentation

### NP Sintering or Alloying: FeAu Small Janus NP

**Core-shells can be formed** when one particle is much larger and is composed of a material with different cohesive energy

#### If both particles have the same size

- Larger inter particle distance => more pics
  - => shift towards blue

#### Inter-particle distance remains constant

Larger particles => more pics => shift towards blue

Absorption depends on size, composition, separation, etc...

## One bigger particle with many smaller ones inside







- 1. Laser is a very powerful and versatile tool suitable not only for the control over nanoparticle sizes but also for a wide range of manipulations with nano objects involving processes such as melting, reshaping, sintering, mixing, etc.
- 2. Examples of laser-induced modifications of smart nano-hybrids, nano-alloys, and multi-material nanoparticles have been presented revealing the role of size, temperature, and composition of nanoparticles, as well as the heating and cooling conditions.
- 3. The obtained results are of interest for the analysis of pulsed laser-induced nanoparticle formation in liquids (PLAL), nanoparticle aggregation-fragmentation experiments, sintering, 3D manufacturing, etc.
